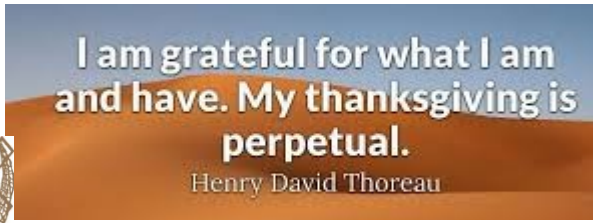
As this Church year draws to a close and we prepare to celebrate Advent, thank you to everyone who makes St. Andrew the special corner of God's Kingdom that it is.

**A THANKSGIVING
FOOD TIMELINE**

— 1621



After surviving their first brutal winter and successfully a food supply, the remaining members of the Plymouth held a three-day harvest feast alongside the native W Indians. Wild **TURKEY** was very likely a component—the centerpiece—of a menu that also included oyster duck, and eel.

— 1792



Early settlers might have used herbs or crushed nuts t birds, but our now-traditional bread-based **STUFFING** butter, salt, pork, and herbs like sage and marjoram—in American cookbooks, like Amelia Simmons' 'Ameri until the late 18th century.

— 1800s



Despite its all-American reputation, **PUMPKIN PIE** y by the British upper classes during the 16th and 17th. But those pies, made from sliced squash and apple, s a thick double-pastry shell, bore little resemblance to custardy, cinnamon-and-nutmeg-spiced versions that homemakers passionately embraced during the 1800 we still adore today.

To modern tastes, the marriage of sticky-sweet sweet i and marshmallow crust might seem like a kitschy rerr Leave-It-To-Beaver era—but in fact, this dish's origins i even further. Marshmallows were a novelty around th of the 20th century and were aggressively promoted b including the Angelus Company (now the Campfire b 1917 corporate recipe pamphlet featured the first-kno **MASHED SWEET POTATOES WITH MARSH Topping.**

Though a staple of the New England larder for centuri a little more than 100 years ago, cranberries could onl fresh, and even then, only two months out of the year 1912, a savvy Yankee lawyer named Marcus L. Urann c cranberry industry—and the landscape of the Thank table—forever. Starting with a single bog, Urann went the company that's today known around the world as Their most beloved (or belittled) product—the log of **CRANBERRY SAUCE** that keeps its shape even w/ from the can—first hit the market several decades lat and is gobbled up by the gallon (about 5,062,500 to b each holiday season.

Holiday "hot dishes" became wildly popular in post-war but few have had the staying power of **GREEN BEA CASSEROLE**. Created in 1955 by Dorcas Reilly, a hon staff member at the Campbell's Soup Company, the re together a trio of classic mid-century "convenience" f onions, canned green beans, and, of course, Campbel cream of mushroom soup. In 2002, Reilly donated her i hand-written recipe card to the National Inventor's H where it keeps company with such illustrious neighbo bulb and the phonograph.
