### From the Deacon's Bench

Brothers and Sisters,

Daniel Lewis Lee was executed Tuesday morning (the first federal execution in 17 years) after the Supreme Court issued an overnight ruling that it could proceed. Lee was pronounced dead by the coroner at 8:07 a.m. in Terre Haute, Indiana. His last words were "I didn't do it. I've made a lot of mistakes in my life, but I'm not a murderer. You're killing an innocent man."

In 2018, the Catechism of the Catholic Church was revised to read, "in the light of the Gospel" the death penalty is "an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person," and it now advocates for capital punishment to be abolished worldwide.

In *A Culture of Life and the Penalty of Death*, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops wrote:

"The death penalty arouses deep passions and strong convictions. People of goodwill disagree. In these reflections, we offer neither judgment nor condemnation but instead encourage engagement and dialogue, which we hope may lead to re-examination and conversion. Our goal is not just to proclaim a position, but to persuade Catholics and others to join us in working to end the use of the death penalty. We seek to help build a culture of life in which our nation will no longer try to teach that killing is wrong by killing those who kill."

If we are to truly profess to be pro-life, we must promote the value of all human life. Let us pray for an end to capital punishment.


