I grew up in St. Michael the Archangel Parish on the west side of Indianapolis and in the shadow of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. Our backyard was separated from the track's property by a chain link fence. Every May we would deal with the traffic and the noise and were certainly aware of the race festivities, but my parents always referred to Memorial Day or Memorial Day Weekend rather than Race Day or Race Weekend. Remembering was the important thing.

All this came to mind as I walked through Calvary Cemetery earlier this week and thought about how we remember those family members and friends who have gone before us in faith. With the pandemic, we missed celebrating our Tri-Parish Memorial Day Mass here at St. Andrew. Refrain:


