From the Deacon's Bench

Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday, I'd like to share a few thoughts from Archbishop Thompson. First a request: Archbishop Thompson has requested that all parishes observe a day of prayer (and fasting) for racial justice on Wednesday, September 9th, the Feast of St. Peter Claver. Let's make the time to pray and to fast that we may soon see the day when all God's children, all created in His divine image, will be treated with justice, respect, and dignity.

And some insights into what's behind the decision to waive the Sunday obligation until November 1st, and what's not behind it: This decision is in the realm of discipline and practice rather than that of doctrinal and moral teaching. Archbishop Thompson is not saying that Sunday Mass isn't important under typical circumstances; rather, he's exercising prudential judgment to help protect the most vulnerable. Those who are not particularly vulnerable to covid complications (and do not have close contact with vulnerable folks) are welcome to show full, conscious and active participation at Sunday Mass.

As Archbishop Thompson has written: "There are great challenges before us during this pandemic and, no doubt, 'staying in place' and 'social distancing' are taking their toll on us. ... Whether inside or outside any given church structure, above all, may we remain Christ-centered in all we say and do."
