

Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ or, from the Latin, Corpus Christi Sunday.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch."

The Eucharist is central to who we are as the Catholic Church. Think back on those long months when we could only make a "spiritual communion" while watching Mass on our TV or computer. As we return to being able to be physically present and take an active part in the celebration of the Eucharist, perhaps it's time to reflect ... not on what, but on Whom we are receiving when we come forward.
